PASE - Not An Alternative OS

Come learn all about OS/400 PASE from our April guest speaker Bill Johnson from CTS. OS/400 Portable Application Solutions Environment (OS/400 PASE) is an integrated OS/400 runtime environment for porting selected UNIX applications

- OS/400 PASE uses the hardware directly
- OS/400 PASE provides:
 - a broad subset of AIX libraries
 - adds more shells and utilities in V5R2
- OS/400 PASE applications can:
 - Use iSeries file systems
 - Call DB2 UDB for iSeries, or Java and ILE programs
 - Exploit all aspects of iSeries server operations environment

IBM iSeries and pSeries share a common PowerPC chip. Using the ability of this hardware base to switch between 64- and 32-bit applications, OS/400 PASE can execute AIX applications on iSeries within OS/400 jobs. Since OS/400 PASE applications execute directly on the hardware in PowerPC mode, computationally intensive applications use the processor without any additional layers overhead. OS/400 PASE is a no-charge option in V5R2.

Free!

OS/400 PASE is not an operating system. A OS/400 PASE application is fully integrated with work management, security, backup, file systems and database. OS/400 PASE provides a very large subset of 32 and 64-bit AIX syscalls and APIs plus nearly 200 common utilities along with the Korn, Bourne, and C shells.

iSeries customers running applications ported using OS/400 PASE do not use UNIX system operations. OS/400 PASE applications run in jobs using standard work management (subsystems), the integrated file system with standard save/restore operations, and standard security.

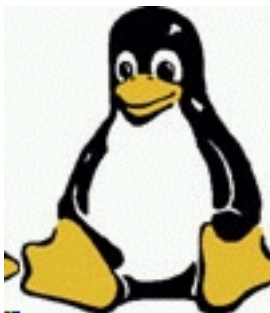
